01

Formation flight requires the prearrangement between the pilots of all involved aircraft.

02

No person shall enter or leave an aircraft in flight except with the permission of the PIC of the aircraft.

03

Parachuting into controlled airspace, an air route or over/into a built-up area is prohibited.

602.27 – 602.28

04

No person operating an aircraft shall conduct aerobatic manoeuvres over a built-up area.

05

No person operating an aircraft shall conduct aerobatic manoeuvres in controlled airspace (exceptions apply).

06

No person operating an aircraft shall conduct aerobatic manoeuvres when flight visibility is less than three miles.

602.27 – 602.28

07

No person operating an aircraft shall conduct aerobatic manoeuvres below 2,000 feet AGL.

08

A special flight operations certificate may authorize aerobatic manoeuvres below 2,000 feet AGL.

09

No passengers unless PIC has 10 hours dual flight aerobatic instruction or 20 hours of aerobatic experience.

10

At least one hour of aerobatic experience in the preceding six months if passengers on board
